1 Purpose

Alberta reliability standard VAR-501-WECC-AB-1, Power System Stabilizer ("VAR-501-WECC-AB-1".

The purpose of this information document is to document additional applicable facilities and to identify where to send required documentation and requests for scheduling an outage as required in VAR-501-WECC-AB-1.

2 Additional Applicable Facilities

Pursuant to the Applicability section of the reliability standard, the AESO has determined that VAR-501-WECC-AB-1 also applies to the operator of any of the following facilities, being material to the reliability standard and to the reliability of either the interconnected electric system or the City of Medicine Hat electric system:

- (a) Generating units regardless of maximum authorized real power rating:
 - (i) None identified at this time.

3 AESO Contact Information for VAR-501-WECC-AB-1

Requirements R1.9 and R1.10 of VAR-501-WECC-AB-1 describe situations where an operator of a generating unit is required to submit documentation to the AESO and request the scheduling of an outage. The relevant contact information is as follows:

- submit documentation identifying the need for time to obtain replacement parts or to replace the power system stabilizer, as required by requirements R1.9 and R1.10, to ARSsubmittals@aeso.ca; and
- (b) submit requests to schedule an outage, as required by requirements R1.9 and R1.10, to outage.scheduling@aeso.ca.
