## Update: Alberta-British Columbia Intertie Restoration Project

This letter is to update stakeholders on the status and timing of the Alberta-British Columbia Intertie Restoration project.

The AESO continues to evaluate and assess all available options for the restoration of the Alberta-British Columbia Intertie to its path rating. We anticipate these evaluations to take place over the next year and we will communicate next steps with impacted stakeholders once we have completed this work.

For stakeholders who receive this letter and reside between Chain Lakes and the area up to Highway 22X, you will no longer be impacted by this project and will not be included as part of next steps and updates. Stakeholders in the vicinity of the Bennett substation near Langdon and stakeholders in the Pincher Creek and Crowsnest Pass areas may be impacted by future project requirements and will continue to receive AESO stakeholder updates.
